I Desire My Children to Walk with God

The Word of God references those such as Noah and Enoch who walked with Him (Genesis 5:24 and 6:9). God does not desire just a select few to walk with Him, but He desires everyone to have a relationship with Him, especially our children.

My family enjoys the outdoors, so it's important to me for my children and grandchildren to take time out of busy schedules and go camping together. It is a delight for me to go walking with the grandchildren and experience life from the eyes of a child. When I walk with them, we talk, laugh, and explore new things around us. There is joyfulness and excitement on our journey together. Just as we share an adventurous walk together, I believe we can share and express the same feelings to our children about walking with the Lord and having a relationship that is delightful and exciting.

Through prayer we can build a strong foundation in the lives of our children and grandchildren. We cover them in prayer and ask the Lord to give them a tender heart toward the things of God and a desire to walk in the paths of righteousness. As our children mature, we pray they will develop unwavering Christian character and learn to put their trust in God instead of people and things.

What happens when we walk with someone? Imagine that you and a close friend are enjoying a walk down a country lane. You are in close proximity. You talk, laugh, listen, and share your hearts. Your attention is focused on this person to the exclusion of almost everything else. You notice the beauty around you or an occasional distraction, but only to point it out to your companion. You share it together. You are in harmony, and you both enjoy the peaceful camaraderie.

To walk with God means you and God are in agreement about your life. "Can two walk together, except they be agreed?" (Amos 3:3). To walk with God means you have aligned your will with His and seek every day to consider yourself "crucified with Christ" (Galatians 2:20).

It is not difficult to identify people who walk with God. Their lives are a stark contrast to the world around them, like stars in a nighttime sky (Philippians 2:15). They produce the fruit of the Spirit rather than the fruit of fleshly desire (Galatians 5:19-22).

In Acts 4:13 Peter and John had been arrested for preaching and were brought before the authorities. "Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated and untrained men, they marveled. And they realized that they had been with Jesus." When we walk with God every day, the world cannot help but recognize that, in spite of our imperfections and lack of knowledge in some areas, we have been with Jesus.

My husband and I often take brisk walks in the evening, my hand in his bent elbow. I like to lengthen my stride and adjust my speed to match his, until we are walking as one unit. I like the wonderful flowing feeling of going up and down together as we speed along our way.

Our goal in our spiritual walk with God is to adjust to his pace and direction until we are flowing with him. The more we move as one with God, the brighter our testimony to others. Parents, grandparents, teachers, or anyone who encounters children, we need to purposefully teach our children to walk smoothly and closely with God.

Enoch is one of just two men which the Bible tells us walked with God as opposed to walking

before God, or walking **after** God. (The second man was Noah.) Enoch lived in the era of longevity. His father lived for 962 years, and Enoch's son lived for 969 years, but we read that Enoch's life on earth was cut short. He had a son when he was 65 years old, then for three hundred more years he "walked with God: and he was not; for God took him" (Genesis 5:24).

Evidently they talked as they walked, and God told Enoch things of the future. In Jude 14 we find that Enoch prophesied that "the Lord cometh with ten thousand of his saints." I can imagine that each walk brought him closer and closer to his God until he was continually thinking about him, getting directions to a life problem, communing with joy. God enjoyed the walks also. More information about Enoch is found in Hebrews 11:5.

"He had this testimony, that he pleased God." So God translated him, or took Enoch to be with him, bypassing death. What a great relationship the two had.

Let's encourage our children to develop a beautiful walking relationship with God.

- Don't allow choices for attending church, praying together, and reading the Bible
- 2. From birth, bring the child to the altar with you for prayer and worship. Hold their hand and walk or shout and jump together when the power falls.
- 3. Help them to daily take their petitions and problems to the Lord.
- 4. During everyday life activities point out evidences of God's attributes.

What joy we will experience together when we are translated to be with our God.
