"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Colossians 3:16).

As a mother, my strength and my peace come as I enter into His presence. I know that in the middle of the spiritual storm raging today the Lord is in control and He is the protector of my children.


