I remember as a little girl singing the lyrics of a song in my Sunday school class that resonates even today. "I may never march in the infantry, Ride in the cavalry, Shoot the artillery; I may never Zoom o'er the enemy, But I'm in the Lord's army." Truly, as adults, God has recruited us into His spiritual army to war in prayer for our children. In God's kingdom, there are no limits to enlist. Even youth and children themselves are candidates to join.

We live in a world full of battlefields that exist in our homes, schools, communities, and many other places where the soles of our feet may tread. It is essential we adorn ourselves with the whole armor of God and engage in spiritual warfare as a "good solider" in the army of the Lord. This is part of a soldier's work (Ephesians 6:10-18, II Timothy 2:3-4).

Spiritual Warfare

From a Christian perspective, spiritual warfare is the war or battle between the forces of good (God's kingdom) and the forces of evil (Satan's kingdom) in the spiritual realm. Evil spirits continually endeavor to intervene in human affairs in an effort to bring destruction to all humanity, including our precious children.

Ephesians 6:12-19 declares, "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places . . . Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand . . . Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit." Spiritual warfare encompasses an arsenal of weapons in combat against the power of the adversary.

Strategic Weaponry

II Corinthians 10:3-6 states, "For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh: For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God." Some strategic weaponry used in spiritual warfare include: the blood of Jesus; the name of Jesus; the Word of God; belief and faith; the Spirit of God; worship/revelation of one true God; prayer/fasting; binding/loosing; divine/angelic intervention; etc.

Prayers are descriptive of odors stored in golden vials that travel into eternity to be poured out at God's appointed time, even beyond mortality. These prayers are so powerful that they never die, but only get answered at an opportune time (Revelation 8:3-5). Like never before, it's time to put our "boots on the ground" and fight for the sake of our children, confidentially knowing, "the battle is not yours, it's the Lord's."

What is the Heart of Prayer?

According to Psalm 119:105 God's Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path. In God's Word, we find direction for the way we should go. Our faith should be firmly anchored in God's Word so that when we don't see our prayers answered immediately, we know that the answer is still on its way (John 15:7; I John 5:14-15).

Prayer is one of the best things we can do for our children. Prayer is powerful (Hebrews 4:12), effectual (James 5:16), and lasts for eternity (Revelation 5:8). Not only is it vital to pray for our children, but it's equally important for them to see us (their parents and role models) praying. By letting them see us seek God in prayer for our needs and the needs of others, they will learn to seek God for themselves. As they witness how God answers our prayers, they will know that the Lord will also answer their prayers as well. Acts 10:34 tells us God is no respecter of persons.

The Bible tells us in Proverbs 22:6 if we train a child in the way he should go, then when he is old he will not depart from it. From that scripture, we can be sure if we train our children to pray when they are young, when they grow up they will know to turn to God in prayer for every situation and circumstance that they face in life.

I am reminded of something that happened when my husband was principal of New Hope Christian School in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. A young student named Mark faithfully requested prayer each day for his grandfather who had a brain tumor. On the appointed day when the doctor opened Mark's grandfather, the tumor simply fell out on the operating table! It was miraculous! Mark had witnessed the power of prayer in his family's lives and knew that God was faithful to answer prayer. After praying for his grandfather, Mark witnessed for himself the power of prayer and the faithfulness of God.

Training children is time-consuming and, at times, difficult. However, the Bible encourages us in Galatians 6:9, "And let us not be weary in well doing; for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

"Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour" (I Peter 5:8-9).

Ephesians 6:18, says, "Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints."

We must not be caught unawares. We cannot be naïve in this evil world. Our children are being attacked by wicked spirits and temptations we have never faced. Find out what they are looking at on their phones. Be the example of holiness to them. If they sense that we don't love or take holiness seriously, they will not keep it dear to their hearts either. Don't be naïve. Watch! If we are not watching them, the Bible warns there is an adversary watching them.

When my husband and I started the United Nations ministry about three years ago, the enemy tried to destroy our family at the same time. I can truly say that prayer, fasting, and others praying for us kept us alive. Even though life can be busy, it is never worth the salvation of our children. We have learned so much on our journey. We will not be caught unawares again. We are trying our best to be sober and vigilant.
