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He is Faithful By Alice Wright



"Know therefore that the Lord thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations" (Deuteronomy 7:9).

The word faithful means that someone is steadfast in his allegiance. His word is given with strong assurance or it is binding.

We learn to trust the character of a person by getting to know him. We must spend time together for our relationship to develop. The same is true with God. Time spent in His

Word and in prayer develops our trust in Him. I have had a relationship with God for fifty-five years. He has never failed to keep His word in my life. Matthew 24:35 states "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away."

When our youngest son was nine months old, he was burned severely on his leg and arm. The morning it happened, my husband was not home so I took my son to the hospital. When my husband returned home and we were not there, he knew something was wrong. He began to pray. While praying, the Lord spoke to him saying everything was going to be all right. He had no idea what that promise meant.

The next day we took our son to the doctor. He told us the burns were second and third degree and would require skin grafts. We went to church and asked them to pray. My husband told them what God had said to him. He also stated he believed there would be no skin grafts because of God's Word.

When we returned to the doctor to schedule the skin grafts, he was totally amazed. He asked, "What have you done"? It was a very easy answer. God had spoken that everything was going to be all right. He is faithful to His word. Our child has no scars on his leg and only one small scar on his arm - a reminder of God's faithfulness.

"God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? Or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?" (Numbers 23:19). When God speaks, we have the assurance it will come to pass.

We may have weaknesses, but God has strength. We may have sin, but God offers grace. We may fail, but God remains faithful. Confidence is not based on our having all the resources needed to take care of

ourselves. Confidence is based upon the truth that God is faithful. Circumstances may change, but we have a never-changing God in control. There is nothing too difficult for Him.

Hebrews 10:23 assures us, "Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised)." When we have nothing left but God, we discover that God is enough.

At times we feel helpless, especially when our children have gone astray and seem so lost, angry, and unreachable. But we have a hope and faith in the Word of God. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

If at a young age we instill in them a knowledge of who God is, and teach that He forgives and His blood covers a multitude of sins, they can make their way back to the fold. Our God i is faithful!

As parents we try to build and shape character in our children's lives. It is important to teach them to have manners, but it is more important to teach them to pray. It will build faith and trust in God that will carry them through life's challenges. We are responsible to not only read the Word but to speak it into their lives.

The children of Israel were instructed to teach their children morning and night, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord." They would speak this over their newborn because they believed it would strengthen him to have greater potential for spirituality.
